CPKF: Fourth Quarter Beats Estimate

CPKF's fourth quarter net earnings rose \$0.4 million year over year, or 36%, to \$1.6 million, while 2014's fourth quarter diluted EPS grew by \$0.11, or 35%, to \$0.41 from \$0.30 posted a year ago. All per share data in this report have been adjusted for a 6-for-5 stock split, paid to shareholders in mid-October 2014. This was better than our estimate, which had called for a small increase in net earnings to \$1.2 million (off by \$0.4 million) and a \$0.01 rise in diluted EPS to \$0.31 (off by a dime). The primary reasons for the difference between reported results and our estimate was that net revenues were \$0.7 million more than the \$8.9 million we had anticipated, total noninterest expense of \$8.1 million was \$0.8 million more than we had projected, and the effective tax credit of 13.2% was much greater than our 22.0% effective tax rate estimate, which increased the bottom line by \$0.5 million more than we had anticipated. In combination, these factors produced net income that was \$0.4 million better than our projection. In July, CPKF declared a 6-for-5 stock split, while maintaining the quarterly dividend at \$0.1125. Notably, CPKF was cited by SNL Financial as one of only 20 banks in the country (and 2 in Virginia) to increase dividends at least 2% per year and at least a cumulative 30% over the past five years. In August, CPKF announced that for the seventh consecutive year, Chesapeake Bank had made the American Banker magazine listing of the "Top 200 Community Banks" in the United States, ranking #28 out of 6,000 banks. We are currently reviewing our estimates and will issue a more comprehensive report when detailed financial information becomes available within the next few weeks.

FOURTH QUARTER

CPKF's fourth quarter net earnings rose \$0.4 million year over year, or 36%, to \$1.6 million, while 2014's fourth quarter diluted EPS grew by \$0.11, or 35%, to \$0.41 from \$0.30 posted a year ago. All per share data in this report have been adjusted for a 6-for-5 stock split, paid to shareholders in mid-October 2014.

This was better than our estimate, which had called for a small increase in net earnings to \$1.2 million (off by \$0.4 million) and a \$0.01 rise in diluted EPS to \$0.31 (off by a dime).

The primary reasons for the difference between reported results and our estimate was that net revenues were \$0.7 million more than the \$8.9 million we had anticipated, largely consisting of noninterest income that was \$0.5 million higher than our projection, as combined OREO expense plus the total net loss on securities was \$0.4 million better than expected, and net interest income that was \$0.2 million greater than our estimate.

On the other hand, total noninterest expense of \$8.1 million was \$0.8 million more than we had projected, primarily reflecting other miscellaneous expense that was \$0.7 million more than anticipated.

Finally, the effective tax credit of 13.2% was much greater than our 22.0% effective tax rate estimate, which increased the bottom line by \$0.5 million more than we had expected. In combination, these factors produced net income that was \$0.4 million better than our projection.

The major reasons for the fourth quarter's \$0.4 million gain versus the prior-year quarter were a \$0.1 million increase in net interest income, a \$0.1 million, or 47%, drop in the provision for loan losses, and an increase in the effective tax credit rate to 13.2% from 1.6% in the year-ago period, adding \$0.2 million to net income.

For the year, CPKF reported net income of \$6.5 million, or \$1.62 per diluted share, down 2% from the \$6.6 million, or \$1.66 per diluted share, posted in 2013, which excludes a one-time \$1.06 million pretax gain on the sale of securities (\$713,500 or \$0.21 per share on an aftertax basis) in 2013's second quarter. Primary contributors to this result were a 47% decline in the loan loss provision to \$0.6 million from \$1.13 million in the prior year and an effective tax rate that was 290 basis lower than the 17.9% posted a year ago, which were partially offset by a \$0.9 million, or 3%, rise in noninterest expense to \$30.5 million.

Net interest income rose \$0.1 million, or 2%, year over year in the fourth quarter to \$6.0 million (\$0.2 million higher than our \$5.8 million estimate), as an estimated 4% increase in average interest-earning assets partly offset a net interest margin that we estimate was slightly lower than the 4.61% earned in the year-ago quarter.

Noninterest income was flat year over year at \$3.8 million, as was noninterest expense which remained at \$8.1 million compared to last year's fourth quarter.

The loan loss provision declined by \$133,000 to \$150,000 from \$283,000 in the year-ago quarter and was the same as our estimate. Loan loss reserves decreased \$0.2 million from \$6.6 million (1.67% of loans) at the end of the third quarter to \$6.4 million (1.63% of loans) at December 31, 2014, and were above the \$6.3 million (1.66% of loans) in the year-ago quarter.

As to other asset quality measures, CPKF recorded a net charge-offs of \$333,000 in the fourth quarter. This compares to net charge-offs of \$87,000 in the year-ago quarter and of \$445,000 for the full year in 2014.

Gross loans outstanding increased \$11 million, or about 3%, year over year, and rose \$2 million, or less than 1%, sequentially to \$392 million.

CPKF posted a 9.4% ROE and 0.99% ROA for the fourth quarter of 2014, compared to 7.8% and 0.73%, respectively, in the prior-year quarter.

On July 1, 2014, Ms. Rebecca A. Foster became Chief Financial Officer of CPKF and all subsidiaries, replacing John H. Hunt, II, who became an Executive Vice President and Business Development Officer for Chesapeake Investment Group. Ms. Foster has been with CPKF for 19 years and held previous positions of Internal Auditor, Money Desk Manager and Investment Officer as well as Assistant Corporate Secretary. She has been in her current role of Investment Officer for the past 11 years and is already chair of the Asset/Liability Committee for Chesapeake Bank.

At their July 18, 2014 meeting, the Chesapeake Financial Shares Board of Directors declared a 6-for-5 stock split to shareholders of record on October 1, 2014, paid in mid-October 2014. At the same time, the Board approved a \$0.1125 per share dividend, paid on September 15, 2014 to shareholders of record September 1, 2014.

In 2013, CPKF hiked its quarterly dividend by 13% to \$0.1125 per share from \$0.10 per share, following two dividend increases in 2012 totalling 20%. The total 2014 dividend payment of \$0.45 represents a 6% rise over 2013's payment of \$0.425. Notably, CPKF has increased the annual dividend payment every year for the past twenty-three years since 1991.

This feat was recently recognized by SNL Financial in a report that cited CPKF as one of only 20 banks in the country (and only two in Virginia) to increase dividends by at least 2% per year and at least a cumulative 30% over the past five years. The company recorded cumulative dividend growth of 51.1% over the 2008-2013 period.

On August 4, 2014, CPKF announced that for the seventh consecutive year, Chesapeake Bank had made the American Banker magazine (formerly US Banker magazine) listing of the "Top 200 Community Banks" in the United States. The bank ranked at #28 in the nation out of approximately 6,000 community banks in the study, up from #148, when CPKF first broke into the rankings in 2008. The ranking is based on a three-year average of return on average equity (ROAE), which for CPKF was 14.07%.

OVERVIEW

Chesapeake Financial Shares, Inc. (CPKF or the Company) is a financial holding company headquartered in Kilmarnock, Virginia, with \$663 million in total assets at December 31, 2014. CPKF is predominantly a small business lender with 12 branch offices that serve customers in the eastern region of Virginia between the Potomac and James Rivers. These offices are located in Kilmarnock, Lively, Irvington, Mathews, Hayes, and Gloucester, with five branches in Williamsburg. In addition, CPKF opened a commercial loan production office in Richmond, Virginia in 2011. CPKF, which began as Lancaster National Bank on April 13, 1900, has a long history and strong ties with the communities it serves.

Operations are carried on through Chesapeake Bank, a state-chartered bank as well as Federal Reserve and FDIC member bank, and Chesapeake Investment Group, Inc. (CIG), an independent wealth management firm that manages about \$313 million in assets (at 2013 yearend) through its subsidiaries involved in asset management (CIG is a registered investment adviser), brokerage, and trust services. Other activities of the Company include Chesapeake Payment Systems, Cash Flow program, Clear Sky accounts, and its secondary market mortgage banking operation.

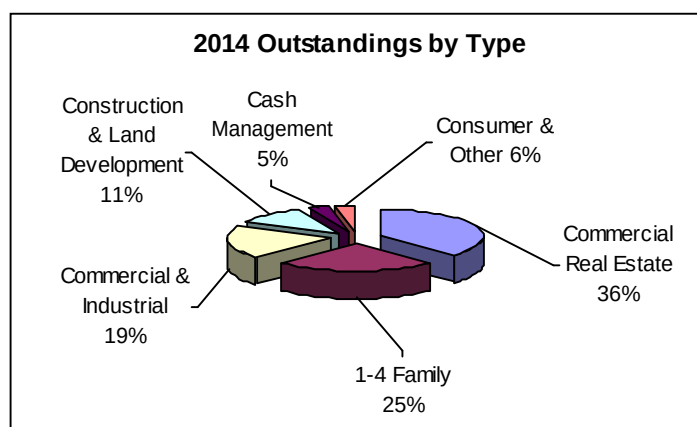
Chesapeake Payment Systems offers merchant processing services such as credit card and debit card processing, electronic benefits transfers, and loyalty and gift card processing to companies involved in travel, entertainment, restaurant, hospitality, retail, mail order, and e-commerce. At yearend 2013, Chesapeake Payment Systems had 571 merchants in its system and processed over \$132 million in merchant card transactions. In addition, Chesapeake Payment Systems has also partnered with four independent sales organizations (ISOs) to expand its processing footprint.

The Cash Flow program, which provides an attractive financing option to growing businesses, involves the purchase of the client company's accounts receivables. The Cash Flow program is currently offered in the Eastern half of the United States and had 79 customers at the end of 2013.

Clear Sky accounts, which offer internet-based retail deposit services for checking and saving accounts and certificates of deposit (CDs), expands CPKF's retail deposit base geographically. At December 31, 2013, Clear Sky deposits totalled \$38 million, with customers in all 50 states.

Through Chesapeake's secondary market mortgage banking operation, the Company services a \$225 million loan portfolio (as of December 31, 2013) of residential mortgage loans for Federal Home Loan

Mortgage Corporation (FHLMC or Freddie Mac), for which it earns a 25 basis-point fee (approximately \$562,500 annually) on the outstanding loan portfolio balance. Additionally, CPKF earns a pare-off fee for residential mortgage loans that are originated and closed with FHLMC, which added \$964,000 to revenues in 2013 (both types of fees are included in other noninterest income in the Company's financial statements).

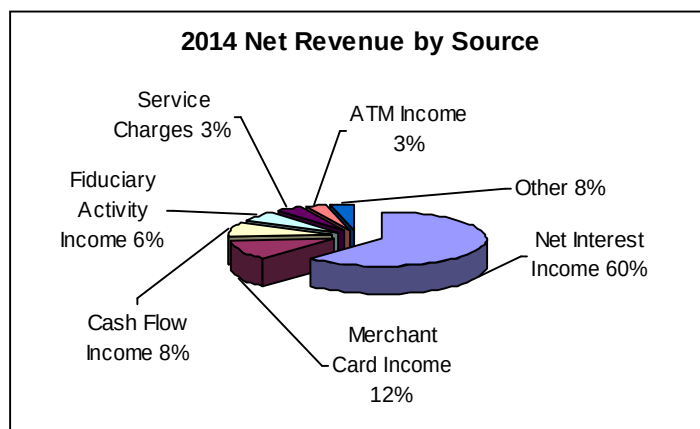


The lending portfolio is dominated by real estate loans, as shown in the chart at left. At December 31, 2014, the lending book consisted of commercial real estate (accounting for 36%

of total gross outstandings), 1-4 family (25%), commercial and industrial (19%), construction and land development (11%), cash flow (5%), and consumer and other (6%). A majority of loans are secured, usually by real estate, inventory, accounts receivable, equipment, machinery, or corporate assets.

At December 31, 2014, the liquidity portfolio, which consists of cash, short-term investments, federal funds sold, and US agency mortgage obligations, represented about 9% of total assets and 19% of the securities portfolio. In addition, the available-for-sale portfolio includes municipal and private label mortgage securities, which accounted for 64% and 17%, respectively, of the total. Core deposits represented 85% of total deposits at December 31, 2014, with certificates of deposit larger than \$100,000 at 15%.

In 2014, net interest income contributed 60% of net revenue, with a significant 40% coming from noninterest income sources. Major contributors to noninterest income include merchant card income (12% of net revenues), cash flow income (8%), income from fiduciary activities (6%), service charges on deposit accounts (3%), and ATM income (3%).



VALUATION

CPKF stock is up 0.9% year to date, better than the 0.3% median loss for the small-cap bank industry, but worse than the 1.9% price gain for the S&P 500, as shown in the following table.

At its current price, CPKF is trading at a discount to the industry median P/E of 10% in 2015, based upon our CPKF EPS estimate for 2015. This is below the average 44% P/E discount for CPKF, based upon 5-year historical P/E averages. Applying the historical discount of 44% to our 2015 EPS estimate results in a price of about \$9.00.

Turning to Price/Tangible Book Value, CPKF is valued at 0.92X versus the industry median of 1.26X. This represents a 27% discount, well below the average historical premium of 19% for CPKF since mid-2008. Applying the historical premium of 19% to our estimated book value for CPKF twelve months out results in a price of approximately \$22.00.

While we recognize that CPKF is still undervalued particularly on a book value basis, we believe that there is no immediate catalyst to drive the stock price higher over the near term.

Accordingly, we have chosen the \$15.50 midpoint of the wide range of values based upon CPKF's 2015 P/E of \$9.00 and Price/Tangible Book Value of \$22.00 as our new target price.

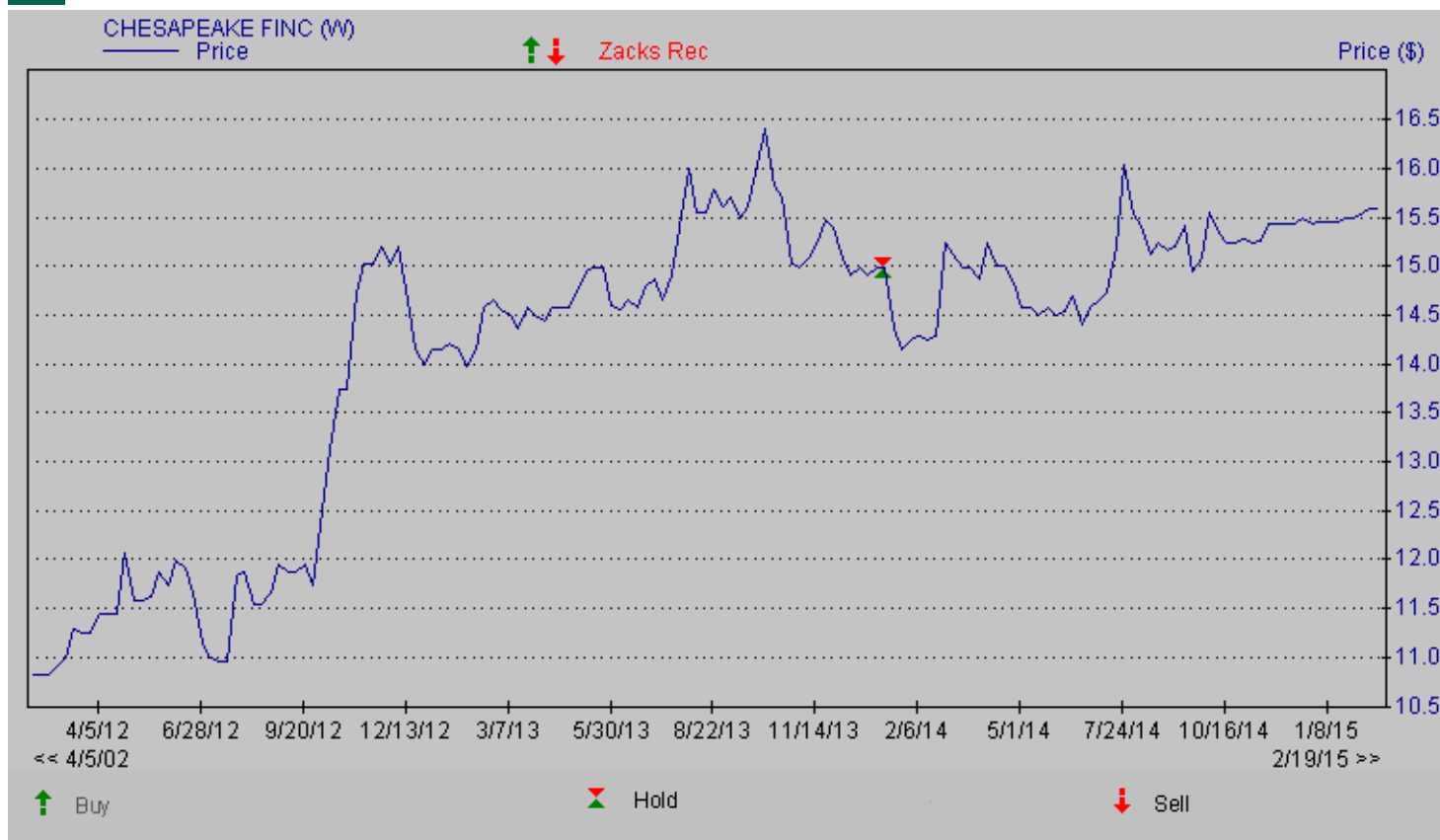
